In the Name of God Amen July 27. 1796 I Thomas
Dillon being low in body but perfect in mind
and memory do constitute and appoint this my
last will and Testament in manner and form
following I wish all my debts being paid it
is my will and desire that the balance of my
estate shall be disposed of in a manner following
that is to say my Son Stewart and Squire to
have all my lands equally divided between them
when they shall arrive at the age of twenty
one years it is also my will and desire
that all my personal estate be sold at publick
sale and that the profits arising therefrom
should be divided between my Daughters
Dorist Margaret Jane Nancy and Sarah when
they arrive of age or marry respect being first
had to my Wife thirds my daughter Mary
McCabe having already had a part it is
my desire that she may have one two year
old heifer more as a full proportion of her part
or the value thereof it is my further will &
desire that my daughter Elizabeth have the

sum of Ten $\frac{1}{2}$ year during her life to be paid out of the profits of my land and should my two sons dispose of the land when they arrive at the age of twenty one years that they shall then pay to my said Daughter Elizabeth the sum of sixty pounds as a full proportion of her part of the land it is also my will that my dear wife Elizabeth enjoy one third of the land her life also one third of the residue of my personal Estate and that she with my children and live on the land and rent the cleared lands, unless it is a small part for a garden and pasture I do hereby appoint my two Neighbours and friends Charles West and John McKinney Junier as trustees to this my last will and Testament and that they will divide the land equally between my two sons and act for my wife and children in a manner best to promote their interest and ease In witness hereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal the day and date above written
