Amen. I Turner Morris
of the county of Jefferson and State of
Kentucky. Through the abundant mercy
and goodness of God though weak of body yet
of a sound and perfect understanding and
here do constitute this my last will and
testament and desire it to be received by
all as such. I most humbly bequeath my
soul to god my maker who gave it me
(Hem) I give my body to the earth from whence
it was taken, and as to my burial I desire
it to be decent without pomp at the dis-
cretion of my Executors hereafter named.
As to my worldly estate I will and positively
order that all my just debts be paid. (Hem)
My will is that my two negroes James and
Vannah with the tools be hired both together
for the term of ten years and at the term

280 of ten years James is to have his freedom. Item, I give to my son John Morris six table spoons and seven tea spoons of silver for which I give unto the hands of my brother Henry Morris to keep till my son John Morris is twenty one years of age. Item, I also give to my son John Morris all my negroes and lands with their appurtenances whatever to the said John Morris his heirs forever. It's also my will that the estate is to come into his hands at the age of twenty one, I also will that my son John Morris shall not be authorized to sell or convey any of the land, spoons or negroes herein willed to him until he arrives to the age of twenty five. I also will that all my moveable property be sold at a public sale. It's my will that my son John Morris is to be kept at school till he is well educated. I also leave it as my will that if my son John Morris should die without an heir that all my estate to be equally divided between the

281 The persons hereafter named my brother and Morrice son George Morris Lewis Bingley's son John Bingley my brother Henry Morris sons and Brother Joseph Morris sons — I also will that there be a mason hired to take down all defects in my house and put it up in the best manner and also to paint the house — I also will that James and Manuel be made to do the inside work of the house in the best manner. I also will the same two negroes is to build a smoke house of hewed logs sixteen feet square with a shingled roof — I constitute Henry Morris, William Campbell and Peter Withers my Executors of this my last will and testament and trustees for my son John Morris — I'm witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 25th day of Sept one thousand eight hundred and ten.
