and ordain this to be my last will and
testament for the disposal of my temporal
Estate which I do inform and ~~mean~~ ^{mean} as
following Viz, I will that all my Just
Debts be discharged as soon as convenient
for my Deceased I Give and bequeath to my
beloved wife Grizel Scott the soul horse
and five pounds in cash to buy her
a new saddle and bridle a bed and cloathing
and after the discharge of debts and the begin-
ning after mentioned she is to have one third
of the personal Estate to by her Enjoyed and
disposed of as she pleases I Give to my oldest
son Hugh Scott part of the land on which
he now lives to be bounded by a line fifteen poles
west of the dividing line now run which is pole
he is to Enjoy during the life of his mother
and brother John I Give to my son William
Scott that part of the land lying on the west
side of the big branch as high up as the big
branch thence a straight line to Hugh
Scotts N. W. Corner as it now stands, I Give
the balance of the land with all the appurtenances
thereunto belonging to be wholly appropriated
for the maintenance and support of my wife
and my son John during their natural lives
and then to descend to my son William who shall
have the privilege enjoying the same by way
of rent yearly on such terms as the

other Executors and Guardians shall think
best to answer the only design thereof which is
the comfortable support of my wife and son John
I Give to my son John the oldest some mare
a saddle and bridle also a bed and cloathing
to be fitted by his mother and ten dollars in
money I Give to my son Samuel cow and calf
bed and cloathing also to be fitted of by his
mother and thirty dollars in money I Give to my
daughter Sarah a horse my spright of that
Land on which they now live also ten dollars in money
I Give to my daughter Nancy Galey ten dollars
I Give to my daughter Hannah the some Horse
Calds barber and if he should die before she is
married I must have a mother of the
same value also 2 cows and calves which
with their increase and her horse shall be
kept for her in the land untill she shall
either wise dispose of them also a saddle and
bridle bed and furniture to be fitted of
by her mother also the Purse now in
the house and ten dollars in money together
with such other things as her mother as
her mother shall see fit to Give her
to fifty and not Exceeding sixty
pounds I Give to my wife the large
bible and hymn book to my son Samuel
the school books the ~~books~~ to be
Hugh and will the Geography history

186. And do law books the Balance of
 the personal Estate after settling
 of the above mentioned legacies and
 debts shall be a deposit in the hands
 of my sons Hugh and William to
 apist them in defending and aspro-
 uals that may appear against the land
 or any part of it. I appoint my son
 Hugh James Carothers and my son
 William as my executors And that this
 my last will and testament may
 be put in execution according to the
 true intent and meaning in every
 part thereof I appoint my brother
 James Scott Joseph Wood and Hugh
 as Guarantors and Counsellors to
 apist my executors In witness where
 I have here unto set my hand and
 seal this 3rd day of October 1804

 benefit and support of my wife and
 children, Viz, Elizabeth, William,
 Lucy, Gabriella, George, Jenny &
 Martha till they come of full age
 or get marriage. And then to be
 disposed of in the following man-
 ner, that is when either of the chil-
 dren become of lawful age or get
 married and with a division of
 the estate it is my desire that my
 executors (after receiving a full
 and ample support for my wife
 Mariah during her life, would
 ascertain the value of the balance
 of the Estate and give to the one
 who my wife with a division his equal
 proportion of the balance so to
 continue to each division in
 relation till the last has his order
 share it is to be understood that
 the reservation made as above
 for my wife Mariah after her death
 shall be equally divided
