In the name of god amen I Zachariah Barr
 of Seppamine & state of Kentucky being weak
 in body but sound in mind and knowing
 it is appointed unto men once to die do make
 and ordain this my last will and Testament
 in manner & form following at the same
 time revoking all others ever made by me
 after all my just debts are paid I give unto
 my wife Sarah Barr during her natural
 life on this part of the tract of Land

411 on which I now live to include what part of it now
 under cultivation she thinks proper to gather with the
 dwelling house & all the household & kitchen furni-
 ture of every description I will that all my negro
 men (now) Wm Stephens Saml & Gilbert be hired
 out annually by son John Barr for which he shall
 receive two dollars for hire the whole and the
 money arising therefrom to go to the use of my
 wife or as she sees best I also give unto my wife or
 all the cash I may have on hand at my death
 with the present crop of hemp corn wheat &c and whis-
 key I will that my wife Sarah retain for her use what
 part of my stock of Horses & cattle Sheep & Hogs she
 may choose with the fowls of every kind & the rest may
 be sold I give unto my wife all the farming utensils
 of every description I will that my wife retain in
 her possession on this place if she choose the rest of
 my negroes (now) Solam and Jude, Liza & Lucia &
 Child I will that after my wife has chosen what
 part of the arable land she sees cause that my
 son John Barr & George Barr shall have the
 balance & supposing there will be about fifteen acres
 or pieces for which they shall pay to their mother
 annually during her life two Barrs of corn or
 acres I give and bequeath to my two sons

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Sons John Barr & George Barr at death of
 my wife the whole of this tract of Land which now
 their heirs serve to be equally divided as near the
 line that has been run by way of the barn to
 an oak by the line but so as to equally divide
 the Spring Snow makes use of giving half to each
 I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Agnes
 Buford when living after her three hundred and
 fifty dollars in cash to enable her to buy land to
 live on the money to raised by my still and the appo-
 rations belonging to them with what stock may be
 sold if that falls short of the above named sum the
 balance to be made out of the line of the negro
 slave that after my wife's decease that all my
 property not otherwise bequeathed be equally divi-
 ded between my three Children John Barr George
 Barr and Agnes Buford except the negro
 woman Susan who with any others she may
 have my Daughter Agnes Buford is not to have
 any part of them but an equal part of all the
 rest of my property not otherwise given for use
 and benefit during her natural life but so as
 it is not to be sold or conveyed away in any form
 but at her death to go to the children and I do nomi-
 nate & appoint my wife Sarah Barr
 executrix of my Sons John Barr & George

 this my last will and testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
 first of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
