Benjamin Gilbert of the County of Sepamire
and State of Kentucky do make and do admit this
my last will and testament, First I order and direct
my will that all my Just debts and funeral expenses
be paid by my Executors hereafter to be appointed
second I bequeath to my wife Mary Gilbert the use
of my dwelling house kitchen and the necessary
buildings attached thereto during her life together
with the use of the household and kitchen
furniture to be under her control during the
same period (reserving to each of my two
children Isaac and Polly a bed and furniture
When they arrive at the age of 21 or if they or either
of them should marry before they are twenty one)
I also bequeath to my said wife during her life
the use and control over the shares of which I am
possest the reversion of I give to my son Isaac
and I do give to my Daughter Polly When they
arrive at age 21 or in any it is provided by my
will that all labour of the slaves shall go to the
benefit of my said wife and children to my
wife the benefit of and I bequeath over my plantation
until my son Isaac shall arrive at a good manly
When he arrives at age 21 my will that he take the care
of the plantation on himself and that ample provision
be made for my wife and family for this purpose I
will that my Waggon horse gear and all the farming
utensils remain on the farm I do my said wife I give a
horse her choice of my stock her saddle
To my son Isaac I give my negro boy Tom to him &
to his heirs forever To the same I give one bed &
furniture and one horse and saddle To my
Daughter Polly I give my negro girl Polina
to her and to her heirs forever to my said
daughter I will one bed and furniture and
one horse and saddle.
To my Daughter in law

Eleanor Gilbert I bequeath the house and lot in
Rich-lasville with its appurtenances to her and
the legitimate issue of her body forever In the case
of failure of issue from her the right to be vested
with the same of the said Eleanor in my heirs forever this
is the same on which my son Ezekiel Gilbert lived
To my son in law William Stephens I give fifty dollars in
addition to what I have already given him -
after the decease of my wife it is my will that the
pragging and farming lands be given to my son
Isaac of the age of 21 or to such as I have sufficient
direction to manage them -

It is my will that after the decease of my wife my land
be divided as nearly equal as may appear to the
discretion of my Executors than my son Isaac to
have his choice which I give to him and to his heirs
forever - I also will that the slaves be divided
as nearly equally as the case will admit of by my
Executors my son Isaac to have his choice that I
give to him and his heirs forever the other half I give
to him and his heirs forever my daughter Polly her
and to her heirs forever. In the case either of these children
should be called off by death it is my will that my whole
property be vested in the other all the household furniture
that may remain after the decease of my wife I will to be
equally divided between my two children Isaac and Polly
It is my will that there be a sufficiency of my stock
retained after the support of my family and covering
in the farm the remainder I desire to be sold at that
ever stock may be on hand after the decease of my wife
I desire to be equally divided between my two children
and lastly I constitute and appoint Nathaniel Hanes
John Eakin and Hugh Anderson Executors of this my
will hereby revoking all former wills
