

In the name of God Amen I, John
Rice of the County of Spotsylvania and State of Kentucky
being in perfect soundness of mind and
memory do hereby do hereby present constitute
and make the following my last will and
testament viz. I give and bequeath to
my son Jefferson Rice my whole right
and title to the tract of land whereon I
now live to him & his heirs forever. also the
tract of land lying on the north fork
of Camp Creek Grayson County and half
of which I have since bequeathed to my
said son Jefferson Rice his heirs & forever
the one fourth of said tract I give and
bequeath to my daughter Nancy Shaw
during her natural life; and at her
death to the heirs of her body forever
the other fourth part being the part
already land of or divided to William Comer
I give and bequeath the same to the said
William Comer his heirs & representatives
forever. My land which is lying there
in Green County and which has been
divided between Jefferson Rice, my son
and my three daughters viz. Susan Comer
Ann Rice and Nancy Shaw; I hereby give
and bequeath the same agreeable to said
divisions to them and the heirs of their
bodies forever or so much of said fourth
part which I now bequeath to my
daughter Nancy Shaw and the heirs
as has not been already sold. I give
my land lying on Rough Creek I give
and bequeath the same to the same
four persons to after the manner I give
my other land at Campy to them and
their heirs forever. Now my land on

Carry, to them and their heirs forever. - And my lands
 in Rochester of one and bequeath to my son Jefferson
 Rice to him his heirs and his representatives forever.
 The negro Gid Beas, which is now in the possession
 of Joseph Chisman and redeemable in eleven
 July next insuing the date hereof. If my son
 Jefferson Rice redeems said Negro, I give and
 bequeath to him and his heirs &c. Stom.
 If give and bequeath to my son Jefferson
 Rice all my right and title to all the land I
 have a claim to and has been already deeded
 lying up to the Kentucky River. To him his
 heirs &c. forever. The bond I have for a
 Hundred acres of land Casey County. I give
 to my Executors hereafter mentioned to sell
 land and to pay William Borner Sherok
 two other debts or debts by me made heretofore
 and claim this my last will & Testament
 and appoint my son Jefferson Rice my
 my friend Charles Darnan my executors to this
 my last will and Testament. I give under my
 hand this 29th of March 1844.
