In the name of God amen I George Barkley of Jefferson County and state of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory Blessed be all mighty in firm and manner follow ing that is to say I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha a Barkley after my death the whole of my estate both real and personal during her widow hood to dispose of for the use and benefit of herself and family as she may think proper while she remains my widow as above stated But if my wife should marry after my decease then in that case it is my will that she shall have the third of my estate and at her marriage the Balance which is two thirds to be equally divided between my four Children and at the death of my wife it is my will that her third of my estate be equally divided between my four children namely Margaret John William William and Barkley or between as many of them as may be living if any of my four beloved Children should die without issue it is my will that their fortune be equally divided between the balance that may be living & I hereby appoint my beloved wife Martha Barkley my sole and only executrix to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made Given under my hand and seal this first day of December 1814
