testament revoking all others heretofore madeIn the first place my will and
desire is that my beloved wife Patsy Ford I
give and bequeath the new profit brought off
one hundred and fifty acres of land to be
paid off out of the tract on which I now
live to include the mansion house, Spring
Orchard, Barn and farm with as much

timber and firewood and also to support
the place for the term of 40 years after I give and
to her and her heirs forever three negroes that is to say
Henry and her two children, Amanda & Jane together
with my household and Kitchen furniture, Farming
implements also my pig and one horse to be chosen from
among my stock of horses by herself and three white
cows to be chosen in like manner from among my
stock of cattle

To my daughter Lucy T.

Fishback and her heirs I give and bequeath right
negroes to wit: Ben, Jeff, Stephen & Harlow, Lucy
and her three children viz: George, Robin, and a
Young Female child the name of which I do not
recollect, two feather beds and furniture all of which
she now has in her possession.

To my son Francis B. Ford

his heirs I give and bequeath one hundred and
twenty five acres of land part of the tract
on which I live for which I have given him a
Note. Also two negroes to wit: Philip and William
two feather beds and furniture all of which
he now has in his possession

my will further is that all my

Estate not heretofore given be equally divided
between my two children Lucy T. Fishback and
Francis B. Ford

Lastly I appoint my daughter

beloved wife Patsy Ford my son Francis
B. Ford, and my son in law John Fishback
Executors & Executors of this my last will and
testament in, witness whereof of all and each of
the things herein contained I have set my
