 married I also further and hereby appoint Ray
 Mose M. Potts & Sally Huchings my lawful
 Executors to this my last will and Testament
 to receive what money I have in the hands
 of Mr. & T. Fry in the hands of said Executors
 for the purpose of satisfying any claim
 that may arise against my lands that I
 have sold or do propose to sell and the balance
 of said money or all of it to be divided
 to be equally divided amongst my said
 children, and my wife - In testimony whereof

I John Sater of the County of ~~Spencer~~ and State of
 Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in man-
 ner and form following that is to say, I give to my wife
 Catharine Ryland a negro girl named Mido, to her and
 heirs forever, I give to my wife the one half of the income of
 my estate to her and her heirs forever, and the use and enjoyment
 of all my estate while she continues my widow, I give to my
 brother Edmund and my brother Joseph's wife the other
 half of my estate after taking out the legacy to Catharine
 Ryland to them and their heirs forever, but they are
 to receive no part of it before the other of my wife until
 she dies again so that each of them, that they immediately
 after her decease should share I do hereby constitute and appoint
 James Huchings & Mr. Garrett Executors of this my last will and
 Testament - In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my seal this 2nd day of September
 in the year 1810

 Order of the 15th June last continuing the will of
 John Sale deceased for further proceedings
 in this Court, that the said will be ordered to be

 Joanna Sale in order to her obtaining letters of
 administration with the said will and account
 annexed she having the said required by law
 and entered into and acknowledged a bond in
 a penalty and with security approved by the
 Court and conditioned as required by law,
 which said bond is ordered to be recorded.
