 County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky this day being
 free
 in reasonable State of Health and sound mind Humbly
 thank his be to god for the same when calling to mind
 The certainty and uncertainty of Death as do hereby can shew
 to shew this my last will and Testament in manner and form
 as followeth. First I bequeath my soul to god who have is
 me and after separation my body to be buried in the dust
 as my executors may think proper. I bequeath to my
 loving wife of her my just debts and paid during her natural
 life or her widowhood the use of my land and plantations or
 part thereof Beginning at farms Longsight land where
 the same cross the branch running through my plantation
 thence with the meanders of said branch thence to our lower
 line and said Branch means an old lane back and the use
 of the improved and unimproved land on the west side
 of said branch Excepting my son Peter Withers improvement
 joining my out fields with the hoop growing thence making
 no more of time but and the claimed land is not to
 be rented during the life or widowhood of my wife
 also all the house hold and kitchen furniture with all
 my farming tools also my negroes old chimney, Larders
 Young Mincey old Lucy and Pelly, also my two horses
 Dick and Hunter with my old corn means and coll
 for also bequeath of three cows and calves and bequeath
 of a calf two years and lambs and calves of turkeys
 also the provisions and grain that is secured for the use
 of the family with all the hump flax & wool thereby

Thirdly. I bequeath to my son James Withers
my walets and all my wearing apparel &c^{ly}
I Bequeath to my son John Withers of his the death of
my wife Dilly Withers one negro man named Charles
3^dly. I Bequeath to my son Peter Withers fifty acres
of land I purchased of John Hurley and also my lands
in the east line of said Branch running through the said
plan towards and of his the death or widow's head of
my wife Dilly Withers all my lands and appurtenances
to my negroes Tom and Rachel at my death
to my son and his heirs forever. 6thly. I bequeath to
my son William Withers two hundred acres of land
which he formerly lived lying in the State of Georgia
and Ten dollars out of my personal estate.
7thly. I bequeath to my daughter Hannah's hands
one negro girl Lucy Martin her possessor and after
the death or widow's head of my wife my negro
Sandon old thing young Winton and Nellie &
her and her heirs forever. 8thly. I bequeath to my
son in law John Hawkins my two negroes Ben and
Joseph to be delivered at my death or as soon as the
crop is finished at my death to him and his heirs
forever. 9thly. I Bequeath to my grand son John
Campbell of his the death of my wife my negro Boy
and to him and his heirs forever. 10thly. I bequeath
to my grand son John Hawkins of his the death or
widow's head of my wife and negro girl Luekey
to him and his heirs forever. 11thly. I Bequeath
to my grand son John Withers son of Peter Withers

and negro man and to him and his heirs forever.
But in case said John should be called off by Death to
said his heirs. So his father Peter Withers and his heirs
forever. 12thly. all and every of my estate not already bequeathed
to be sold to the best advantage as my executor or executors
may think best and the money arising from said said
with all my and standing debts and moneys found in my house
to be equally divided between my living my wife Dilly Withers
and first children namely James Withers or his heirs &c^{ly}
Withers or his heirs Peter Withers or his heirs Hannah
Campbell or her heirs my son in law John Hawkins
or his heirs and lastly of all of his the death or widow's
head of my wife Dilly Withers all and every of the
personal property already bequeathed or not to him
during his or her widow's head with all or any thing
gained thereby to be sold to the best advantage
by my executor or executors and the profits arising
