

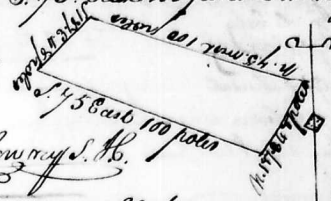
Beginning at a tree known as the 18th East

In obedience to an Order of the Sepamine County Court at their November Term 1815 appointing the Subscribers hereto or any three of us
 Commissioners to allot dower to Margaret Hawkins late Margaret
 Singleton on the lands negroes and personal estate of Edmund Singleton
 deceased we the said Subscribers did meet at the late residence of said
 Edmund Singleton deceased on the 14th and proceeded to allot dower
 to the above named Margaret Hawkins the following part of said
 Estate (viz) of the land two hundred and fourteen acres which will
 more fully appear to the Court by reference to the plat and Certificate
 made out by the Surveyor of Sepamine County marked and
 tract from the deed made by Andrew Lewis to Edmund Singleton
