before the above sum of forty one Dollars or so much thereof
as is not paid then be paid to her Children I have and
I have alike.

Marrs one Dollar in addition to what he has received
of me heretofore

I further give and bequeath unto the Children of Ruth
Anderson formerly Ruth Marrs forty Dollars to be
divided share an share alike

I also give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Marrs
one Dollar in addition to what he has received of
me heretofore

I also give and bequeath unto my son William Marrs thirty
four Dollars in addition to what he received of me heretofore

I also give and bequeath unto the Children of my son
John Marrs Eight Dollars to be divided share an share alike

I also give and bequeath unto Samuel Marrs son of John
Marrs one horse to be of the value of fifty Dollars

I also give and bequeath unto Lethia Marrs daughter
of my son John Marrs nine Dollars

I also give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons James
& Josiah Marrs all the remainder and residue of my
estate of whatsoever nature and kind it may be both
real and personal to be equally divided between them
both share and share alike

and lastly I appoint my trusty friends John Dallas
Peter Pondexter with my two sons James & Josiah
Marrs my executors of this my last will and Testament
thoroughly revoking all former wills by me made in writing

After the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the Court of the County of Jefferson to settle the estate of Edmund Singleton deceased have again by the order of the Court of said County examined the accounts & vouchers of the estate of said man's widow and disbursements made by them to stand as herein after reported to-wit: amount of money which came into the hands of the estate &c from Bonds and notes belonging to the estate which came into the hands of the said estate since the death of P. Singleton on Collected - \$5895.46.5

Amount due on notes not collected - \$1099.

Note the aggregate amount of \$6994.46.5 appears to us from the vouchers was received by the testator while sole and of John Hawkins since his intermarriage with the said widow and third part of which is claimed by said Hawkins and wife for her proportion of the monies above mentioned in the right of the said widow as widow and relict of P. Edmund Singleton dec'd which leaves a balance to be accounted by P. Hawkins and wife of \$4662.94.33

We the undersigned Commissioners are fully satisfied that the above statement of monies received & disburse by the estate and the said John Hawkins are correct they having produced to us satisfactory evidence to justify the above statement and we are further of opinion that the said Hawkins and wife ought to be allowed for their trouble attention and extraordinary expenses in collecting monies paying it out and taking notes receiving negroes &c &c up to this date the sum of \$74 Cents which sum deducted from the sum of \$4684.17.33 will leave the sum of \$4730.43.5 cents to be accounted for by the Estate of
