I Samuel Pankney of Jefferson County & State of Kentucky being sick and afflicted of body but of sound mind disposing memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth
Vizt After all my Just debts ~~are~~ paid out of my estate I give and bequeath to my ~~beloved~~ wife Mary Pankney all my estate both legal and personal During her natural life and at her death I give to my sister Lucinda Sallustious & minor children one negro Boy named Amos and to said Henry Sallustious one Negro Boy named Randolph the balance of all my estate both real and personal I leave at the sole disposal of my wife at her death I also appoint and ordain my wife Mary Pankney executor to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this 18th day of March 1817
