 this my last will and Testament. It is my will
 and desire that my body be committed to the
 Earth after a Christian like manner and to
 my worldly estate it is my will that after my
 death it may be disposed of after the
 following manner (1813)

I give and bequeath
 to my brother Francis Paythips and to my sister
 Elizabeth Peniston the land and plantation
 whereon I now live containing one hundred
 and fifty acres, be the same more or less with
 all and every benefit arising therefrom to
 gether with the following Negroes (1813)

Matt. Lucy Milla Syddo Sarah and Peter
 her child and Bozwell for their support
 and maintenance during their natural
 lives and further it is my will that the
 surviving one at the death of the other shall
 possess the whole Estate above bequeathed
 for their support and maintenance during
 his or her natural life. It is further my
 will and desire that after the death of my brother
 and sister above named that Bozwell

Paythips Peniston have the above described
 land and plantation whereon I now live together
 with the following negroes (1813) Matt. Lucy
 Milla Syddo Syddo and Bozwell them and
 their increase to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my nephew John
 Peniston after my death the following property
 namely Jupiter Henry and all her children that
 she may have at my death to him and his heirs
 forever. I give and bequeath to my

nephew Samuel Peniston a certain tract of land
 lying and being in Montgomery County
 Kentucky for which I have a title containing
 One hundred and forty six and some half
 acres be the same more or less together with
 the following Negroes (1813) Andrew Amy
 John Myra and they and their increase
 to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to
 my nephew Thomas Peniston the following
 negroes Mary Syddo and their children she may
 have at my death also Syddo and after the death
 of my brother and sister above named I give
 to the said Thomas Peniston Sarah and her child
 now together with their increase to him and
 his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my nephew
 Thomas Peniston Peniston the following Negroes
 (1813) Jim and Sarah to him and his heirs
 forever. I give and bequeath to my niece

Anna Metcalf (a laos Anna Peniston) Peter
 and Charlotte with her increase to her and
 her heirs forever.

When a girl child have a negro
 man by the name of George Surra out in Rich
 land Virginia I give and bequeath the said

Negro man after my death to Samuel Metcalf of Bolivar County Virginia to him and his heirs forever

I further ordain nominate and appoint my sister Elizabeth Peniston Samuel Peniston Thomas Peniston and Robert Pythys Peniston my sole Executors and Executors to this my last and testament Given under my and seal this twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine
