and testament revoking all others

I pay all my debts of which there are
but few and none of magnitude are to be
promptly paid as soon as circumstances will
permit. I to my dearly beloved wife
Rosanna Reed I give and bequeath the use and
profit of one third of my real estate during
her natural life also one negro woman named
Milly also all my house hold and kitchen
furniture of every description also all my farming
utensils and all my stock of every description
except so much as my wife and executor may
think fit to sell the proceeds of the sale to
be applied to the use and benefit of my
wife and four youngest children
I then I give and bequeath to my daughter
Margaret Brown one negro girl named
Sinda during the natural life of my wife
at her death Margaret Brown is to return

the negro girl Sinda and in the place of
Sinda I give and bequeath to the said Margaret
Brown my Negro woman named Milly to have
and to hold her forever

Then I give and bequeath to my two sons
John and Thomas one slave named Joe for the
term of ten years after my decease after which
term the said Joe is to have his freedom it is
further my will and desire that my said sons John
and Thomas will pay to my two daughters Betty
and Polly Reed three hundred dollars when
the said Betty and Polly arrive to the age of
twenty one years. Then I give and bequeath
to my son Archy H Reed all that tract or
parcel of land laying on the east side of Lods
Road including my dwelling house ^{outward}
it to have and to hold said tract or parcel
of land forever. Then I give and bequeath
to my son Preston B Reed all that tract or
parcel of land laying on the west side of Lods Road
to have and to hold said tract of land forever.
The said Lods Road to be the dividing line between
the said Archy H Reed and Preston B Reed it is
further my will and desire that my sons
Archy H Reed and Preston B Reed shall have
one half of the stock of every description
at my wife's decease and all the farming uten-
sils. Then I give and bequeath
to my two daughters Betty and Polly Reed
one negro girl named Sinda at the decease of
my wife ~~decease~~ my wife with her inventory
of any she may have also one half of all my

Stock of every description also all my house hold and kitchen furniture except one bed and bed clothing which my son Thomas Reed is have at my decease.
