I William Anderson of the County of
Jepamine County and State of Kentucky

Being in the proper use of my mental faculties
Considering the date of my age and the uncertainty
of life I judge it expedient to make a will to show
how my estate may be disposed of after my
decease. First to my beloved wife Catherine
I will and bequeath in case she may be the
longest lived the house in which I now live with
thirty acres of land adjoining to be laid off in
such manner as she may deem proper, and the
following negroes during her life my negro
man James and his wife Vilet my negro woman
Crisp also my two boys rope spinners Roubin &
Joseph Together with all my household and kitchen
Furniture it is my will also that my son Oliver
Anderson who will live with my wife that he may
receive such donations as my wife may think proper
to confer on him within her lifetime Secondly
To my Son John Anderson I will the one half
of a five hundred acre tract of land lying in
Barren County on Beaver Creek the tract to be
Equally divided between my Son John and Charles
Anderson in quantity and quality I also give him
Money to set him up in the blacksmith business
which all the legacy I intended for my son
John Anderson Thirdly To my daughter
Jane Anderson I will a negro woman called
Peggy and her three children as her part of my
estate, Fourthly to my Son Hugh A. Anderson I
give one hundred and ninety five acres of land in
Jefferson County whereon he now lives also
a negro man Will by name Together with

Other presents heretofore given as his part of
my estate Fifthly To my Daughter Sarah
I gave an negro boy Ben by name with a horse
and some some household furniture as her
part of my estate Sixthly To my Son Charles
Anderson I give Two hundred and fifty acres
of land in Barren County the one half of a
five hundred acre survey the other half of which
I have given to my Son John Anderson also a
Negro B. Lowder by name a horse Bridle and
Saddle a bed &c as his part of my estate Seventh
To my daughter Mary I give a negro girl Susan
by name a horse Saddle and Bridle a bed &c as
her part of my estate Eighthly To my daughter
Sophia I give a negro girl Paddy by name a horse
Saddle and Bridle a bed &c as her part of my
estate Ninthly To my two Sons Robert and
William Anderson I give three hundred and eighty
in Jefferson County adjoining Stephens Survey to
be equally divided Between them To my Son
William I also give a negro boy Isaac by name
and to my son Robert a negro boy Mathias
by name Also a horse Saddle and Bridle to each
of my Two least named Sons and in case my
Son William who is now in the army should
not return it is my will that his legacy
be sold and equally divided Between my four
daughters to wit Sarah Mary Sophia and
Susannah Tenthly To my Son Oliver
Anderson I give Two hundred acres of Land
the tract on which I now live with all its appur-
tenances except the thirty acres which I have reserved
for my wife during her life at her expiration of

by name Together with my waggons and all my
farming utensils with the horses which I may
have also a Negro man Cuff by name I gave to
my son Oliver after the decease of my wife
who is to have him during her life Eleventh I my
daughter Susan it is my will that my estate
if I don't live to do it myself purchase her
a negro woman Between the age of twelve and
fifteen years out of the proceeds of the hire of
my three Negro Boys who are now hired to the
tobacco making Business also a horse and a saddle
Bed and furniture as her part of my estate
It is my will that after the Decease of my wife
that the portion of the estate which I have left
her and by this will designated all except the
land and the negro man Cuff which are to
be to my daughters The rest to be equally divided
Between my four daughters Sarah Mary Sophia
and Susanna It is my will that fifty acres
of my land be sold that part of my land
adjoining a Mr Moors for the purpose of paying
off all my just debts and the surplus money
for the land to assist in purchasing my daughter
My Daughter Susanna the Negro above spoken of
Lastly I constitute my two sons Hugh A Anderson
and Oliver and the executors of this my last
will and testament Revoking all other wills
wills heretofore By me made acknowledging this
Only In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal This the
Twenty fifth Day of April in the year of our
Lord One thousand Eight hundred and fourteen
