In the name of God amen I William Bowers of the County of Jefferson and state of Kentucky being of perfect mind and memory (and in perfect health) calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do thro the merits of Almighty God Make and ordain this my last will and testament in the following manner and form as to my worldly goods wherewith it has pleased God to bless me I give and bequeath in the following manner First I desire that

all my Just debts be paid I then give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine all my property of every description and at her death I desire that all my estate excepting such as is herein after mentioned be sold and the proceeds therefrom be divided amongst my seven Daughters and their heirs namely the Children of Joel Florence names unknown Mary Elwood Elizabeth Reed Nancy Florence the six youngest Children of Francis Amis the Children of Catherine Chendon she had by her first husband Robert Beasley and the Children of Polly Tuning it is be distinctly understood that Children of each mother herein named shall have the part allotted their respective mother I desire at the death of my beloved wife that my son Peter have immediate possession of the Land on which now live and also a negro boy named Jack and a good Bed and furniture I nominate and appoint my truly Friends John Hawkins senr and John Will Tunney senr. my executors and And I do hereby Ratify and Confirm this to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
