but it be remembered my son in law pays
no interest to the Estate on their notes given
to me I further direct that each son
in law note the sum thereof be added
to their accounts standing against them
I further direct they shall settle with
my son Robert McGrath & his

accounts is in his hands, with my son
I further direct that where I am taken
ill for death they shall be paid extra for
their trouble & my house and to be not
paid I direct my executor to sell to the
best advantage given bonds as they shall
think proper & when every thing is settled up
I direct my executor shall make an
