In the name of God Amen - I Ezekiel Hayden of Sparrow County and State of Kentucky Being Weak of Body but of Sound and Perfect Mind and Memory blessed be eternally god for the same do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz - I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Eliza Hayden the land on which I now live (after my lawful debts are paid) to be sold after my Decease as soon as possible and also give and bequeath unto her a negro girl named Phyllis and a negro Boy named Jackson and also a negro boy named Jackson during his life and it is my Desire that all my Stock and House hold and Kitchen furniture of every kind together with these negroes herein named to be sold the monies of the negroes and Living Stock Ham Lard and Pig and the money which my Stock and furniture and these negroes will bring when collected all of it to be given to my beloved Wife Eliza Hayden to be disposed of in the manner and form following Viz - To my Daughter Peggy Jackson I give and bequeath five Dollars - I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Whiston County five hundred Dollars - I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Polly Catts five hundred Dollars also to son Grandson Hayden County five hundred Dollars and as he is not of age it is my desire that his grand Mother my Wife shall purchase land for him with his Part or if not to appropriate and apply it to the most prudent and profitable use for him - And to my Daughter Mary Catts I give and bequeath One thousand Dollars to be equally divided among 4 of her Children namely Richard Catts, Peter Catts, Eze Hayden Catts, Sally Catts and William Catts and Oliver Catts It is my Desire that this money must be given unto my Daughter Catts to be divided amongst her Children herein named to have as it can conveniently be collected and it is my Will and Desire that my son Eze Hayden is to have One Dollar having given him his Part formerly, And in the next Place It is my Will that my Grand Children Peter Hayden and John Hayden have Two thousand Dollars apiece or each of them is to have the same which is to be left in my Wife's hands for them until they come of age and in the Event of her Death before that period shall arrive It is at his option to appoint the person or persons in whom

The can receive confidence sufficient to put it in his or their hands To keep keeping to be delivered to them as they come of age My Wife has chosen either to dispose of the negroes stated in this my last Will and Testament to be sold either at private or public Sale as she may think proper any money that is left after my Wife gives each legatee or legatee named her and her Parts as before stated and after all my lawful debts shall have been paid such money my Wife is to have at her disposal and for her dearest support during her natural life and she may leave the negroes built to her and her money and property that she may have to them the blessing at her Death - And I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Polly Hayden Executrix and my son Eze Hayden CoExecutor of this my last Will and Testament hereby Repealing & annulling all former Wills and Testaments by me made - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12th day of October and in the year of our Lord 1818

I John Eakin of Sepamire County Estate of Kentucky do make & ordain this my last will and Testament First it is my will that all my last title which are few be paid together with all the expenses of my lying being waited on in sickness and funeral expenses be paid I bequeath to my friend James Patton with whom I have lived for some time my Bed and Furniture all that appertains to the same to the said James Hequeath \$200 in Cash and to his Son John \$100 to be put under the guardianship of his Father by my Executors To Sarah Patton the Daughter of Roger Hequeath \$50 in cash To Margaret Patton To William John To Matthew Eliza Maryanna Children of the above named Hequeath each of them \$20 in Cash to be given to the legacies when they arrive to 15 years of age To Margaret M^{rs} Davells the Daughter of my friend Calvert M^{rs} Davells Hequeath \$100 in Cash to be paid her when 15 years of age The remainder of my property bequeath to be equally divided between the surviving children of my two Sisters Hephiah Houston and Margaret Malone and my Brother William Eakins three children To John Eakin the son of my said Brother Hequeath my Watch, my books and Clothing I bequeath to my friend James Patton executor I constitute & appoint James McCampbell and Andrew McCombie of Sepamire County Executors of this my last will Testament Vesting in each of them Power to convey any lands by Deeds that I have sold Signed Said & acknowledged in the presence of
