In obedience to an order of the Jefferson County Court it is directed at their January Term 1822, being first day of January we caused a Survey of the Land of the late William Price deceased to be made by R. Shultz Deputy Surveyor of John Lucy Esq. Surveyor of Jefferson County and have caused to lay off the same of ~~other~~ <sup>the</sup> acreable to the instructions contained in said order continuing 9.5 Acres including the mansion house and orchard, as will more fully appear by the plat of said Survey herewith annexed and marked. As which is made a part of this report - at the same time at the request of the Heirs and Representatives of Said Heirs and by their joint obligation herewith annexed and made a part of this report and marked, &c. they being all present or represented by persons properly authorized except the heirs of James C.
