First I Will and desire that my Executors herein after named do as conveniently and as soon as they can after my death pay all my just debts and Funeral expenses and as to the rest and residue of my estate that shall or may remain; I give and dispose of as hereafter provided or Willing to my wife Lucy Bowen I give unto her during her lifetime the plantation whereon I now live together with the use of so much timber off the tract as will be sufficient to support the farm and pasture meadow, and the following named negro slaves to wit, Harriet Davis, the younger, Anne, and Noah, do I give her during her life

Sister Elizabeth Hughes sixty dollar after my just debts
are paid I wish the balance equally divided between my
three Brothers Mathew James and Washington
I own Spire and bequeath to my Brother William
my Sorel has bridle and saddle are now in
