In presence of God and I Ephraim Farquhar of Jessamine County
and State of Kentucky, enjoying some degree of health of
body and of perfect memory, thanks be given to God calling
into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men now to die. Do make and revoke this my
will and testament that is to say principally and first of
all. I give and recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian burial at the
discretion of Executors. Nothing troubling but at the general resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of
God and touching such worldly estate wherewithal it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life. I give and devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. First it is my will that as
soon as convenient after my death all my just and lawful debts
should be paid. Secondly it is my will that my daughter
Hannah Young shall occupy the premises on which she now lives
if she thinks proper until my wife's death. Thirdly I will
that my son Peter Farquhar shall have the privilege of living
on the lot on which he has began a tanyard until my
wife's death. Should he think proper and at the discretion of
the estate after my wife's death the profit of fixing the
shall be his own. Fourthly it is my will that at my death
my daughter Nancy Bates have one horse and one cow and
fifthly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah the
balance of the land on which I now live that is not heretofore
divided or with the house and other improvements, with the
household and kitchen furniture and as much of the stock
and other property as she may think proper to keep for her
support during her life. Sixthly it is my will that as the
death of my wife Sarah all my lands and other property
shall be equally divided amongst all my children namely
Hannah Young, Martha Heager, Ann Young, Daniel Bell,
Peter Farquhar, James Farquhar, Ephraim Farquhar, John

Mass Wilson and Peter Farquhar Executors of this my last will
and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and
