and State of Kentucky enjoying some degree of health of
body and of perfect memory thanks be given to God calling
into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die Do make and ordain this my
will and testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian burial at the
discretion of Executors. Nothing doubting but at the general retri-
bution I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of
God and touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. First it is my will that as
soon as convenient after my death all my just and lawful debts
should be paid. Secondly it is my will that my daughter
Hannah Young shall occupy the premises on which she now lives
if she thinks proper until my wife's death. Thirdly I will
that my son Peter January shall have the privilege of living
on the lot on which he has begun a sawyard until my
wife's death. Should he think proper and at the decision of
the estate after my wife's death the profit of fixing this
shall be his own. Fourthly it is my will that at my death
my daughter Nancy Bates have one horse and one cow and
fifthly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah the
balance of the land on which I now live that is not now for-
feited of with the house and other improvements with the
house hold and kitchen furniture and as much of the stock
and other property as she may think proper to keep for her
support during her life. Sixthly it is my will that at the
death of my wife Sarah all my lands and other property
shall be equally divided amongst all my children Mary Miller
Hannah Young, Martha Heager, Ann Young, Sarah Bell
Peter January, Ananus January, Ephraim January, John Bell
