In the name of God Amen I Francis Lewis Son of Jepamine County and State of Kentucky being of sound and disposing mind and of good memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments heretofore by me made viz. First I will and desire that my Executors herein after named do as conveniently and as soon as they can after my death pay all my just debts and funeral expenses and as to the rest and residue of my estate that shall or may remain I give and dispose of as hereafter provided or Millar to my wife Lucy Lewis I give unto her during her lifetime the plantation whereon I now live together with the use of as much timber off the tract as will be sufficient to support the farm and for fire wood, and the following named negro slaves Lewis, Harriet, David, the younger, Ann, and Noah, do I give her during her life

only, together with the household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils and such portion of my stock of every description as as the may think proper to keep after my wife death the negroes with their increase that I have above willed her must go to my children as here after. With the other property I will my wife she may dispose of to the children at her death as she pleases, except the land that must be disposed of by my executors as hereafter directed as willed to my daughter Peggy Lawry & George Bourns, Susan Cunningham and Sally Perry, and my youngest daughter Lucy Jefferys I have heretofore given them as much of my estate as came to their full portion. Moreover it is my will and I trust that it be regarded that they get no more of my estate I now think proper to dispose of the balance of my property to my other children in the following manner. To my two Grandsons (sons of my son John James) & Andrew Frederick I give them when they come of age my negroes Rachel and Fidelity children of my negro woman Sarah to gether with the increase of each negro to be divided between my said Grand Children by my executors and should either of my said Grand Children die before he attain the age of twenty one the negroes must go the survivor the property given to my said Grand Children sons of my son John is to be in full of the portion I intend for them & so is my son John James to receive any more of my estate for I have already given him and his children as much as thereof as I intend them to have, therefore it is my will that my son John and his children get no more of my Estate. To my son Francis I willed I will and give him two hundred acres of my land including the plantation whereon he now lives his north line is to continue on a short line with the fence which divides his field from the one called my eighteen acres field to John Bourns survey thence to my corner marked with a stone and from thence up my southern line to a corner marked for quantity I also give to my son Francis my negroes Milt and Sarah, both of which negroes he now ^{will him and no more to my son Benjamin} has in his possession, the above is what I will and towards Acres of land including the plantation whereon he now lives to be laid off in this way. Bourns commencing at the corner now

Milt's running on the line which divides me from the widow's place to my corner nearest black Bob farm from thence down my northern line before that when a parallel line is run of the same length from the beginning a short closing line will embrace or include the hundred acres I want him to have I also will unto my son Benj's two negroes named Ann and Mary to gether with her increase which makes the amount of what I intend for him it is further my will and desire that my Executors herein after named do after the death of my wife divide my land which is not disposed of heretofore equally between the following children to wit, Susan the younger, William, Polly, Lewis, Morton, & Agnes and should it must be equally divided according to quantity and quality among them I wish and will that my executors do make this division sooner if any of my first six named children want their part after marrying or attaining the age of twenty one I also will that my son James have his part when he wants it if he dies without heirs it is my will that it go to my child or who are next in line to my Benjamin my son should he die with heirs I will the land to said heirs or heirs of my son James. It is also my will that if any of my children die without lawful heirs or heirs that the property I have heretofore willed go to my surviving children I mean Susan the younger William, Polly, Lewis Benj's Lewis Morton and Agnes. It is further my will that also of my negroes that is not heretofore disposed of be divided equally among the following children as they attain the age of twenty one to wit, Susan, William, Polly, Lewis, Morton & Agnes. As to my son James I will him none of my negroes, in lieu thereof I will and desire that what remains of my stock household and kitchen, furniture & farming utensils are what my wife retains agreeable to will to be sold the proceeds thereof to put by my executors hereafter named into the hands of David Abbott to deal out to James as may be right if it is never right to give it to him it must go to the children who live with me now, to my son William I will a horse of mine named Benner & also this interest in my dead cat, that he take him in his care and of what he makes with him retains what is right for his trouble & give

the balance to the family, I mean for the benefit of my wife and her family,
I now hereby appoint Elijah Bowen, Francis Bowen and Benjamin Bowen
my executors and hereby empower them or so many of them as may qualify
to the my will and Testament to convey and divide my land as hereby
