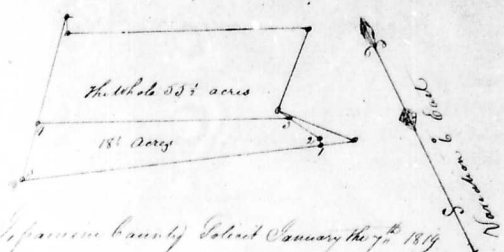

I James Dunn of the County of Sparrow and State of Kentucky being weak in body But of sound senses and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following: First it is my will that all my Just debts be paid I Give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Dunn One third part of all the land I possess in this State and One Negro Girl by the name of Susannah together with all the household and kitchen furniture during her natural life and she has full power to dispose of said Negro girl at her Death in any way she may think proper. I Give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Martha Dunn One Chosen Slave Girl of my flock of horses Exclusive of her Equal part of my Estate. I Give and bequeath to my beloved Son Alexander Dunn One young colt which he claims for his. At the Death of my wife my estate is to be equally divided among all my Children viz John, Martha, James and Alexander Dunn except the Negro Girl above named But should my Executors think it best to sell the Land sooner they have full power to do so and to divide the balance of my Estate as above mentioned. And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my Wife Elizabeth Dunn my Executrix and my son John Dunn & my Executors to this my last Will and Testament. Given under my hand and Seal this 11th day of March 1815. James Dunn
