I agreeable to an order of the Sepanimo County Court made at their Feb'y Term 1822 appointed us the undersigned Commissioners to divide the Slaves belonging to this estate of James Overstreet Dec'd. between the heirs & said decedent's family. Between May Howard late Mary Overstreet who intermarried with James Howard William Overstreet Rice Overstreet and Elizabeth Overstreet having met at the house of William Howard proceeded to make a division between said heirs and report as follows to wit that there is six negroes of the following value to wit

Discharge of woman 10 \$600
 Mulinda & child about 14 years 300
 Sedonius D. about 14 years 150
 George a boy six years old 150
 James D. 14 years old 200
 Whole amt. \$2100

These being given heirs the proportion in values to each
 been is the sum of \$525 — Mr James Howard & wife
 as well as Fisting Corner Guardian for William Overstreet
 Alice Overstreet and Belleand Murray the guardians
 of William Elizabeth (Overstreet) being present and
 attending the division — We have allotted to
 Mr Howard Malinda D \$500 - Elizabeth Overstreet
 Sedonia at \$450 Belleand Overstreet George at
 \$450 and Peet Overstreet Susannah & Fanny \$700

The Guardian of Rice to pay Williams Overstreet
seventy five Dollars on acc of his proportion of the personal
estate the Guardian of Rice to pay the Guardian
of Elizabeth \$75. And to pay Mr Howard \$25 which
sums will give each man the sum of \$525 each in
value Given under our hands & seals this 29th
day of Feby 1824.

We the undersigned having met and examined the accounts of Benjamin Williams Guardian for the heirs of Elijah Williams Dec. agreeable to an order of the County Court of Spurrine made at their Dec. term 1820 and found \$477. 87½ in his hands left by a settlement made with him on the 21st day of February 1818 and also found vouchers in the said Williams hands as follows
