

In the name of God amen, This Twenty Seventh day of September 1819, I James Suttan of the County of Jefferson and Commonwealth of Kentucky Being Weak in body, but sound in mind and memory Thanks be to God for it therefore Calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and declare this my last Will & Testament, That is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it to my body I recommend to the same so that at the general resurrection I may receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form

I then first I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Jane the use of my whole estate both real and personal until my son Daniel Suttan comes to the age of twenty one then she is at liberty to take her share, Item I then give the sum of Whorem lawfully begotten of his body, Item I give unto my son William Suttan one dollar, Item I give unto my daughter Sally Suttan one dollar, Item I give unto my daughter Sally, Secd one dollar further it is my wish that when the money are collected that are due to me from James Suttan that my executors shall apply it to the best advantage for the benefit of my said youngest daughter Item it is my wish that all of my personal Estate should be divided between my daughter Sally Suttan, Elaney Suttan, Margaret Suttan, Suleman Suttan, and Jane Suttan after paying all of my Just debts, further it is my wish that the timber shall not be cut down only for the use of repairs

Also I nominate and appoint my Loving wife Jane Executrix & Samuel C Steel Executors of this my last will and Testament Witness my hand and Seal the Date above the word bequeath entered and signed In the presence of us Subscribers James Suttan
