I, Jane Wilkerson of the County of Sepulchre and State of Kentucky, do hereby constitute and ordain the following as my last will and testament (Viz) First to my grand sons Russell Woodard and Wesley Woodard I give and bequeath to them after my death A certain Negro boy named Lewis the said boy is to be sold when the said Russell and Wesley Woodard then they shall arrive to the age of twenty one and the money to be divided equally between them both - 2^d & I give and bequeath to my grandsons Robert Woodard and Hillary Woodard after my death A certain Negro boy named Albert the said boy is to be sold for the best price and the money equally divided between them both - 3rd I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Amelia Woodard after my death A certain negro girl named Mally with her increase to her the said Amelia Woodard and to the heirs of her body lawfully be gotten forever - Now be it remembered

that my Executors here after named is hereby empowered and directed to purchase negroes for the best price that may be had for my support and to pay him for his services until the said legacies above named shall arrive to the parties designated for the reception of these legacies and the hire of these negroes all over supporting of me and paying my Executors it is my will and desire that it may go to my daughter my wife and another child that is now living with her not mentioned in the will should either of the negroes die before the legacies to them is devised by this will come to that age or time before devised for their reception of said negroes then it my will and desire is that the legacies to whom its devised by this will that have the most come in with the balance of the children not mentioned in the will I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Woodard the whole of the balance of my Estate of Every description after that my just debts are all paid to her and her heirs not mentioned in the will forever I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Francis Miller be it the sole Executor of this my last will and testament Given under my hand and seal this the 16th day of January 1820
