To us directed we have proceeded to examine the accounts of John and Thomas Hawkins Administrators of John Hawkins deceased and find their amount and disbursements as herein noted viz that they fell into the hands of John and Thomas Hawkins the present adm^s, Cash notes as appears from the former settlement \$1425.47 1/2 cents but by Reexamination we find the following errors (viz) One No^o 2 a w Peter and John Campbell for \$104.25 cents which was collected by James Hawkins the former administrator and charged to him as per receipt Also collected by said administrator \$32.81 cents on a note of \$116.00 cents one Henry Darby making the sum of \$137.06 taken from the above and leaves a balance of \$1417.41 1/2 cents which sum \$1005.55 1/2 etc was in Commonwealth's paper amount of sales made on the 5th day of December 1822 by the present adm^s in silver \$378.86 cents

Amount of rents for the year 1824 in silver \$11.68 1/2 etc Amount of rents for the same year in Commonwealth's paper \$124.62 1/2 cents (Amount of Negro hire for the year 1824 in silver \$126.13 1/2 etc the aggregate amount including notes & rents and negro hire which came into the hands of the present adm^s amounts to the sum of \$1879.82 1/2 of which sum \$1064.98 1/2 cents was for Commonwealth's paper and \$4919.00 1/2 cents was for specie.
