I order and it is my will that my wife Mary keep the house hold and kitchen furniture four chairs cows and two of the choice out of my horses with as many of the hogs and sheep and as she wants as much of the crop as will be sufficient for her and the stock which she keeps one year also I plan to and have and two paid year and Maggon - " at the death of my said wife the negroes as the proceeds arising from the compact under which I hold them is to be equally divided between my two daughters Catharine Butler and Evelina Moson and estate which I may have which has not been herein before appropriated I order to be equally divided between the said Catharine and Evelina I hereby appoint my wife Mary Giles Butler Executrix and John Perry Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and face this 1st day of November 1820 James H. Butler Test

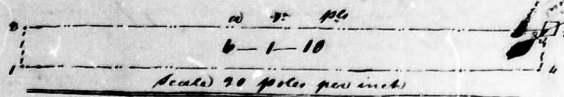
