In the name of God amen I John Ticklen of Spartanburg County and State of Kentucky being weak of Body but of Sound and Perfect Mind and Memory considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of Sound & blessed be almighty God for the same do make and publish this to be my last Will and Testament in manner And for following Viz: First I give and bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Mary Ticklen the plantation on which I now live during her life and it is my will and desire that it should not be sold by herself nor my Children the legatee during her life and should she die before my younger Children come of age it is my will and desire that it should be rented out for the support and maintenance and Education of my younger Children I also leave my bed and wife the stock that is on the farm and the farming utensils and all things necessary and belonging to said farm And it is my desire that after my wife's decease and my younger Children as before stated come of age that then and not before that period I wish an equal Division to take place of my Estate among my Children and my Grand Child Sally who lives with me that is my Daughter Polly Peyton's Child whom it is my will and desire that she should have her full and equal part with my Children herein named as follows Viz: Sarah Ticklen Polly Hampton John Ticklen William Ticklen Thomas Ticklen Lucy Ticklen Charles Ticklen Joel Ticklen Polly Ticklen Rice Ticklen and Polly Ticklen and also my Daughter Sally Peyton her part particularly is to be due and to the heirs of her Body in that Lewis it is to be fixed by my Executors

Heroin named in their Counsel that my Daughter Sally
Payton Husband namely Benjamin Payton shall not
have any share in her part or division of the Estate that
to be entirely appropriated to her use and the heirs of her
Body so that said Payton may not of people harvest in
his power to get her division or part and destroy it
Moreover that is my will and desire with respect to my Daughter
Sally and her husband Benjamin Payton can't legally be
accomplished I also have my beloved Wife Polly Ficklin
Executive Together with my son Jarrod Ficklin Executor of
this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former

Thomas Overstreet Two hundred Dollars each to be paid
to them when they come of age or marry " 3rd To my
Grand children Lawrence Ramsey James Ramsey Elizabeth
Ramsey and John George Ramsey Children of my deceased
son John Ramsey I give and bequeath One hundred
Dollars each and I do further direct that my executors
after named do put out the monies given to my said
four last named Grand children to interest & appropriate such

portion of the Estate as he my exec^{or} shall deem proper to the education
of said 4 Children. I give all the real and residue of my estate and
personal or mixed I do desire and direct to be equally divided
between my two children James and my Daughter Sally and to
them and their heirs forever 5th My negro man Ben at my death
is to be free 6th Having herebefore given unto my two daughters
Polly Overstreet and Sam Ficklin as much of my Estate as they
are entitled to I do hereby declare that they are not to receive any part
portion of my Estate in any real estate lastly I do hereby
appoint my friend Abraham Logan my executor to this my
last will and Testament In testimony Whereof I have unto set
my hand and seal this 11th day of October 1817
