Pursuant to an order of the Sepaminc County Court at their November term 1823 we the undersigned Commissioners therein appointed, proceeded to examine and settle the account of James Young administrator of the estate of John W Young dec'd and from the vouchers produced to us the above acct to be correct leaving a balance of twelve hundred and eight dollars twenty nine and one half cents due the legates part in Notes not collected now in the hands of said admr also we proceeded to divide the Slaves of said dec'd and produced by said admr among the legal representatives of S dec'd viz To Amrose Young one Negro man called Charles one boy called Eliah the same name valued at eleven hundred and eighty five dollars To Jane Harrison one Negro woman called Polly one boy called Sarah and one Negro woman called Amy & her Child Matilda valued at eleven hundred and fifty dollars and to the heirs of Amr Young died one Negro girl called Sedona one do called Pamela and two boys the same name valued at twelve hundred dollars amounting in the whole to thirty five hundred & thirty five dollars the one third being \$11786 which is an equal proportion of the Slaves for each of the above named representatives given under our hands this 31 day of December 1823

 Agreeable to an order of the Court made at their next term 1823 regarding the land of John Lamkins Cam met with a Thomas Smith Commission to Divide the Extra claims of Scott Drove between the heirs of Saml Scott & his Deputy Surveyor of the County John L. Hays arrived at the 1st day of August 1823, attended on the Land of Saml Scott by the direction of the Court inasmuch as did proceed to lay off the land as follows
 Lot #1 Beginning at a State corner to the Drove in the Shawnee run road then 1/2 mile with a road to a stake at A, thence S 41° E 83 poles to a stake at B, thence S 41° E 83 poles to a stake at C, thence S 41° E 83 poles to the beginning containing 13 acres
