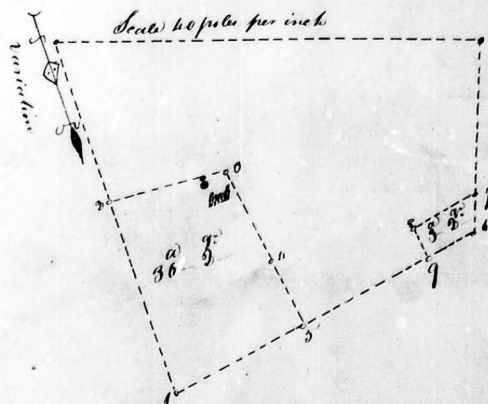

of Jefferson State of Kentucky wishing to dispose of all
my property do hereby make public and declare my last
Will and Testament in the manner and form as follows
1st It is my Will and desire that I should have a decent
Christian burial and that the necessary expenses thereon to
be duly paid to gether with my just debt of every description
2nd by It is further my will and desire that my mother
Mary Lewis have and enjoy to her own separate use and enjoy-
ment the whole of my estate real and personal and for the purpose
of securing that object and preventing other from controlling
my estate or making it liable to the debt or future contract
of my father or any other person I do hereby convey the whole
of my estate in trust to my sister Margaret Lewis and her

husband John S. Lewis to the use and benefit of my mother Mary Lewis as aforesaid and it is further my will and desire that my mother should by her last Will and Testament if she thinks proper dispose of the estate hereby granted but if she fails to do so or to dispose thereof during her natural life which she has power to do it is then my will that whatever portion of my estate remains at her death be applied by my two last heirs to the support and maintenance of my father Nicholas Lewis during his natural life and that at his death the whole of my estate which may not be disposed of by my mother be equally divided between my two sisters Mary Ann & Eliza and Sarah W. Blakey and their heirs forever and Hannah H. Lewis infant daughter of Hannah Lewis deceased I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Beverly B. Blakey executor of this my last will and Testament Signed published and declared in the presence of the Witnesses here on this thirtieth day of August 1840.
