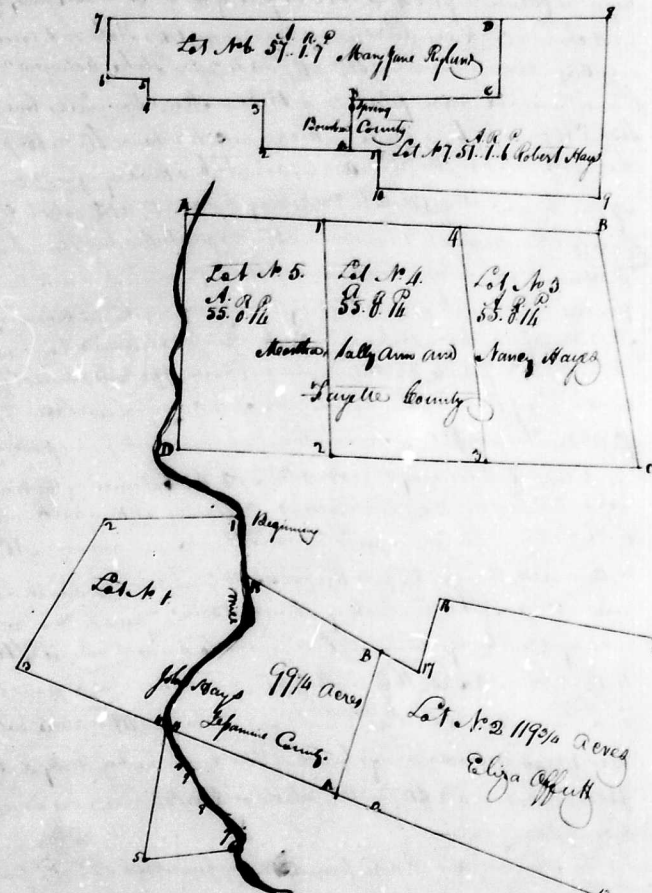

To Nancy Hays the balance or 1/3 part of the tract of land in Fayette County containing 55.6.14 valued at \$1,108. 75 also 1 negro girl Sally, 1 boy John & 1 girl Eliza, valued at \$624 making in all \$1,732. 75 which is \$23. 25 under her equal share to be received in specie — The three last named girls to receive an equal proportion of profits arising from the rents & of 5/8 tract of 165.1.2 of land in Fayette County until they agree in the manner they will divide the same, as at 10 now considered joint and common stock among them, the division of Land & slaves is consented to by part of the heirs who are of full age & the guardians for the balance of the heirs under age who together with the heirs of age, hath subscribed their names to this report.
