

Same court 1822 we the undersigned commissioners met in Nicholasville on the 20th of June 1822 and proceeded make the Settlement agreeably to the foregoing Statement - The amount of assets in the hands of the widow we find to be \$337.94^{ts}. and the amount of Credits \$39.50, leaving a balance of \$298.20^{ts} from which deduct the widow's dower which we have allotted \$99.40 leaves a balance in the hands of Elias Griffin Guardian of the heirs of \$198.80^{ts} cents. which being agreeably divided will be \$33.13^{ts} cents to each of the heirs - and after deducting the credits which appear in the foregoing Settlement the guardian stands indebted to

" Sarah " 26th 80^{ts}

and to Jefferson, Pinkney, and Harrison Huchstep \$33.13^{ts} cents each
