to be half my stock of hogs, sheep and cattle except three cows of the 1st choice and two heifers and one star cow the two Dollars each I also give unto her a half doz silver spoons a half doz silver tea spoons and half the value of my silver soap spoon also half the money arising from the sale of my Negro man named Tom and half the money arising from the sale of my household and kitchen furniture and farming Utensils except two feather beds Bedsteads and furniture two ploughs a bareshare and shovel two iron wedges two axes one log Chain one Cooper's adze one long gallow Kettle one Brass Spire mortar one large Chest six Pater plates one basin and one dish one cistern and set of Shoemakers tools with Smocks and profits thereof to dispose thereof in her own way for herself and her heirs forever

Item 2nd I give unto my son John Walker forty pounds and my silver watch already in possession to him and his heirs forever. Item 3rd I give unto my son Randol Walker forty pounds already in possession and my shotgun which is to be delivered to him by my Exec at my death to him and his heirs forever. Item 4th I give unto my son William Walker thirty pounds already in possession and Ten pounds to be paid to him by my Exec out of the money arising from the sale of my property at the time of my death to make him equal with my other two sons to him and his heirs forever. Item 5th I give unto my four daughters Eliza Patterson Elizabeth Robert Sally Strager and Fanny Boggs forty pounds to each of them to be paid to them by my Exec out of the money arising from the sale of my property at my Death to them and their heirs forever. I also give unto Lucy George and Betsey George Daughters of John George five or seven more to be equally divided between them at the time of my death for the natural affection I have for them to them and their heirs forever

will and desire is that Lucy my Negro woman and her children to be equally divided amongst my children and Lucy to go to the one she may make choice of and as to the remains of my estate both real and personal except three feather beds and furniture which I give to my said wife I will shall be sold and the my said wife to have one hundred and fifty dollars out of the proceeds thereof and the balance to be equally divided

amongst my then surviving children or theirs forever. I therefore constitute and appoint my beloved wife Lucy Executrix and my two worthy friends John Masly and John Lancaster Executors to this last will and Testament in testimony whereof I set my hand and seal this 12th day of February 1822 in presence of

Pursuant to an order of the mosthipful Court of Izard County dated Decr Court 1821 we the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the said Court to divide the estate of Francis Lowen deceased Having met at the dwelling house of said decedent on the 28th day of December 1821 and the land of said decedent having been surveyed and plotted and one hundred and sixty acres allotted to Lucy Lowen his widow pursuant to his will including the cleared land and improvements on said farm. we proceeded to allot and divide the balance of the land among seven of his children and Segages as follows To James Lowen lot N. 6. containing twenty two acres To Susanne Lowen lot N. 1. containing seventy four acres To William Lowen lots N. 7 in two parcels containing one hundred and four acres To Polly Lowen lot N. 3 containing ^{seventy} seven acres To Lewis Lowen lot N. 4 containing seventy acres To Morton Lowen lot N. 5 containing seventy two acres To Agnes Lowen lot N. 2. containing seventy four acres all of which well more fully appear by reference to a survey of said land plotted numbered and annexed hereto and after allotting to said Lucy Lowen four negroes named Noah Harriell David and Moses given her by said decedent to wit. we proceeded to divide the balance of the negroes belonging to his estate among six of his children agreeable to his said will after the following manner
