The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Jepamine at the September Term 1817 have proceeded to examine the accounts of John H. Norton Administrator of Richard Ridgely and find that the personal estate as per Account of Sales amounts to the sum of \$200.00 and the debt which said estate has paid amount to \$100.00 and four dollars and 12 cents all of which he has exhibited satisfactorily. He also finds that the said Norton has received for the hire of Slaves from the farm since the death of said Ridgely the sum of one thousand & forty nine dollars & 73 1/2 cents and he has paid out to the widow towards her and her children Dower the sum of fifteen hundred and seven dollars for which he the said Norton has the receipt of the widow in due form that he has paid for the said dower the further sum of two hundred and dollars & 33 cents. He also finds that said Norton has in his hands sundry obligations for negro hire and rent amounting to nine hundred and eleven dollars and of which will probably be collected. The widow being entitled to one third of the gross of the estate and the children the other two thirds and ordered that the widow should have the whole amount of rent and hire for the support of herself and children she having at all times supported them and after allowing the above five per cent on the amount paid out which is \$2073 the Commission will amount to \$111.30 which being added to the above leaves a balance due the estate of nine hundred & forty five dollars & 43 1/2 cents and he has raised in his hands to collect to the amount of nine hundred and eleven dollars which when paid will be a credit for so much and the balance due him to be raised from the estate by hire of Slaves &c. all of which is respectfully submitted together with the Account and Vouchers herewith returned Given under our hands &

The undersigned Commissioner find that the personal estate of Mr. Ridgely came to the hands of ~~Richd~~ ^{Richd} Morten and no part to the Ridgely. We also find that Richd. Ridgely was indebted at the time of his death to Frederick Ridgely the amount of the note above stated which with the interest amounts to \$468.21 that Richd. Ridgely at his death was indebted to Ridgely and Pindell \$101.25 by acct duly proved which has been discharged by ~~Richd~~ ^{Richd} Ridgely. Consequently the estate of Richard Ridgely is the hands of the heirs is bound to him ~~Richd~~ ^{Richd} Ridgely therefore and if no assets remain other than slaves they could be sold to pay the debt. We also find that Ridgely Pindell & Ridgely Pindell and Satterwhite have rendered medical services to widow Childers slaves of the decedent as appears by their accounts duly proved to the amt. of the two last items in this account which amount is only chargeable in the real third of the estate. & as ~~Richd~~ ^{Richd} Ridgely has discharged those accounts as appears by the receipt the same is due to him

First I give my land in Lepanum where my daughter Elizabeth Darnel lives to my son William Price to him and his heirs for ever Reserving half an acre to include the burying ground in such a form as my Executors may direct for a burying for any person that may choose to bury their dead thereon also I reserve ten feet wide to the road and the remainder of my estate of every kind whatever as negroes Sams and his children my son Lucy Harris Battle Sup. V. to be laid off in equal lots

as nearly as at my Executors can do that is in four equal parts the first part to be given to one of my daughters Sally Daniel the second lot to one of my daughters Sarah stratus the third lot to one of my daughters Elizabeth Patten the fourth lot to Samuel or Richard Ridgely children of my daughter I am to be determined which of them by lots to be drawn for them by my Executors And I do appoint my two friends John and James Martin Executors of this my last will and testament and if my wife should survive me that they allot her thirds of said estate my dear is that the Court don't require security of my D. D. Price Executors to prove said Estate but that my Executors draw up an inventory of said Estate and set out they may think just and right In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 8th of February 1821
