Jepsum County January 9th 1826

I Jeremiah Lowry and the full and entire possessor of all the faculties of my mind but no low bodily strength and in consequence of the uncertainty of human life do make constitute and ordain to my last will and Testament hereby annulling and revoking all others by me heretofore made. I have first having great affection for and entire confidence in my wife Prudence it is my desire and will and I hereby expressly bequeath to her during her life if she should continue unmarried the farm on which I now live and all other my estate whether real or personal mixed of what nature soever or wheresoever situated that no matter of affection to my wife may be attributed to me for this conditional devise I declare that the sole motive inducement to is love for my children and a determination I have made for many years that no man but myself should have the control or management of a Father over my children. And second I have an equal regard and affection for all my children it is my will that at my the death of their mother my whole estate of what nature soever it may be shall be sold by my executors for cash in hand and the money divided among them or among such of them as may then be living taking care to give to the representatives of such as are dead if such should be the case a child's part. Should my wife however think proper to marry then it is to be expressly understood that the whole estate which I have given her is to cease and determine absolutely to use intents and purposes as if she were actually dead and my executors are to proceed forthwith in manner as is done

directed to sell and divide the Estate among my children. I have given nothing to my children during the life and widowhood of their mother whose affection for them I well know and to whose guardianship under care and kind reprob. a good Father confidently intrusts them. It is my will and desire that my wife Prudence and my friends David Polley and Joseph Debo should be the executrix and executors of this my last will and Testament and I do accordingly to constitute and appoint them with full powers to act accordingly. It is further my desire that those of them who undertake the execution hereof shall not be required by the Court to enter into any security in any amount whatever upon first entering upon the duties specified therein no at any time or times unless upon suggestion to the Court that it would be prudent to act & then the Court shall require such security as in their discretion may seem proper and sufficient of all or either as is required by the Court so to execute bond & security their their powers as executrix or executor shall forthwith cease and determine. It is further my desire that once in each year my wife executrix and executors shall make a full and entire settlement of every thing appertaining to their duties and enter the same on record of the County Court of Jepsum. It is further my will and desire that all my property collected for debts due or hereafter to be come that as well as the produce of the farm may be placed at the disposal of my wife once in each year as the trouble and burden of the family will for the most part devolve on her.
