I Michael Robb of Jefferson county and state of Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner following to wit I first it is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Robb my plantation whereon I now live together with all my farming stock of every kind during life except she should think proper to sell some of the stock then and in that case the money arising from said sale to be equally divided amongst my heirs It also my will that at the death of my beloved wife Elizabeth Robb that all my estate both real and personal be sold and equally divided amongst my heirs except Frederick Robb my son who received one hundred Dollars which is to be deducted out of his equal part also Henry Robb my son who received one hundred Dollars which is to be deducted out of his equal part also John Smith my son in Law who received one hundred Dollars to be deducted out of his equal part also my son Isaac Smith who has received twenty dollars which is to be deducted out of his part also my son Michael Robb who has received twenty five dollars to be deducted out of his equal part also my son John Robb who has received twenty three dollars which is to be deducted out of his equal part. 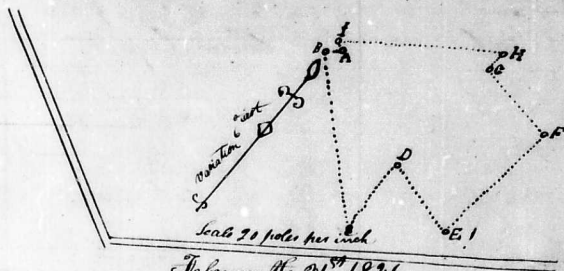
