Approable to the annual order of the Sheriff for the County Court of Sepaminc we the undersigned did on this day meet at the house of E. T. Weston bond del^r for the estate of the Estate of William Bradshaw died and proceeded to make a settlement of said Adams accounts and reports as follows to wit: We find from the sale bill that the sale of the personal property on the 1st day of Jan^y 1824, and which became due & payable on the 1st day of Jan^y 1815 amounted to \$1125.25 and that he rec^d for hire of negroes and bond debts did the decedent \$613.17¹/₂ making a total amount not receivable on the 1st Jan^y 1815 of \$232.15. We also find from proper vouchers that he disbursed for the Estate during that period \$112.2.47¹/₂ upon which we have allowed him 3rd cent as a commission which leaves a balance against him on the 1st Jan^y 1816 of \$1143.03 we also find from vouchers that he rec^d during the year 1816 for cash & hire of slaves for the year 1815 which was due & receivable on the 1st Jan^y 1816 \$1093.55 which added to the balance due on that day for the year 1815 viz \$1143.03 amounts to \$2236.58 that he disbursed during that year \$246.17¹/₂ cent on which we allowed him 3rd cent which added to the disbursements of that year taken from what he was chargeable with for three years left a balance against him of \$2103.71¹/₂ we provided in the same manner for each year from 1816 to 1824 and find the balance against him of \$255.40 cent we then paid to the Calculators the interest for the balances in the hands of the Adm^{or} at the end of each year for one year which amounts to \$1193.67 which added to the balance in his hands to wit \$255.40 will produce the sum of \$2440.14 the balance due from the Adm^{or} on the 1st Jan^y 1824 from which we have deducted \$205.47¹/₂ for extra services which added to the contingent and disbursements will make an aggregate amount for services & disbursements of \$450.94 we have also entered him with \$12 for paid day services of the Commissioners which added to the \$450.94 will make for extra services will amount to \$462.94 which taken from the sum of \$2440.14 the balance due on the 1st Jan^y 1824 will leave a balance including the interest on the balance of each year remaining in the hands
