I William Cole being weak of Body but of perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will & testament in witness and from following 1833, I give to my beloved wife Deborah Coley one thousand Dollars to be paid down to her out of my property which may be in my possession at my decease which may not manifestly insure my real estate and to be preserved she will not want to move the property from the Common Stock I am indebted. To my Daughter Jane A Coley four hundred Dollars. To my Daughter, Abigail Coley four hundred Dollars: and to my Daughter Margaret Coley four hundred Dollars: and to my Daughter Abby Ann Coley four hundred Dollars, but as there is a prospect of her being expected in her way if that should be the case I wish her share to be raised to six hundred Dollars and to be managed for her benefit by her brother John During her life and at her death to be divided amongst her brothers and sisters in proportion to the several legacies in case she has without hind of her own. The balance of my estate real and personal I give to my two sons John and Amos Coley to be equally divided between them I wish my intention to all as much of my personal property in the first instance as will pay all my just debts. It is my wish also that my family remain together in the youngest child is of age at which time I wish this division as above stated to take place as respects the children who is my wish that if there should be any one in time between my sons with regard to the management of the funds so as to create an happiness in the family I desire that my youngest son Amos Coley may be bound to sound good profitable trade at the discretion of my Exors.

I wish all my children to have a reasonable education
in proportion to their standing or prospects in life. In case
my property should increase or decrease before the time
mentioned when it is to be divided - I wish to erect by my
will of girls and boys to be married or left in proportion to
the valuation it may bear at my decease it is to be
understood that Abby Ann my daughter as mentioned
above is not to be considered to come under the provisions
as thus stated in life she is so far off as to require
no prospect in life - I do hereby appoint my wife
Deborah only Samuel O Byly and John W. Laublin
Executors of this my last will and Testament. In
