I Benjamin Martin of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky being in perfect soundness of mind and memory do hereby constitute the following as my last will and Testament (Wt):

It is my will and desire that after my death all my just debts be paid out of my Estate. After which it is my will, and therefore I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Martin during her natural life the house and plantation together with the land whereon I now live together with all certain negroes yet named Anson, her and her increase forever and at the death of my daughter Betty Martin is my will that the whole of the land and plantation whereon I now live be divided among the Legates hereafter named mentioned, and after the

named hereafter hereafter. It is my will that immediately after my death that the whole of my Estate both real and personal be equally divided between my Children (Sons) Lucy Martin (Aline Lucy Martin) Abner Martin, Lindsey Martin, William Martin, Polly Martin, Betty Martin, Peter Martin, Gabe Martin, James Martin and Larkin Martin to them and their heirs forever with the following exception (Sons) Except the 1st It is to be understood that my daughter Betty Martin enjoy the land and premises whereon I now live during her natural life and at her death that to be divided among the above named Legates after the order of the rest of my Estate.

Exception the 2^d Wherein stated that I son of my daughter Polly Martin (alias Polly Martin) It is my will that he shall have the One half of what she and her heirs may be entitled to.

Except 3^d It is my will that upon a Division of my estate under that my son William Martin or his heirs receive as his portion Twenty fifty dollars less than any other Legate mentioned.

I do hereby revoke all and every other wills, state whatever and constitute this as my last will appointing my two sons Lindsey Martin and Larkin Martin and my son in law John Martin as my Executors thereto. I William Marshall of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. First it is my will that all my just debts be paid. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Marshall the manse whereon I now live as any part thereof that she may share together with what house hold and kitchen furniture she may think proper it is also my will that she shall have a good and sufficient support out of that part of my farms which I set down given to Abraham Niles my son-in-law during her life also my negro

a woman named Sarah during his life, also what stock she may think proper and it is my will that at his death the property be left to her to be equally divided between my four surviving children. I give and bequeath to my son Henry Marshall my equal half of the Millinery also my mill with its appurtenances together with all my land lying on the west north side of the mill race including the South branch of the river and including the mill dam. I give and bequeath to my son-in-law Abraham Vines all the balance of my tract of land whereon I now live. I give and bequeath to my two sons John Marshall and William Marshall my tract of land lying on Rockman Creek whereon William Marshall now lives to be equally divided between them also my negro boy Henry to be equally divided between them. It is my will that my negro boy George be hired until he is seventeen years of age and then sold and the proceeds with the hire to be equally divided between my surviving children. I give and bequeath to my Grand son Joseph Marshall Son of James Marshall, dead the sum of eleven hundred and forty Dollars to be paid as follows: Henry Marshall to pay three hundred and thirty Dollars, Abraham Vines three hundred and thirty Dollars, John Marshall two hundred and fifty Dollars, William Marshall two hundred and forty Dollars, all the above mentioned sums to be paid when the said Joseph Marshall arrives at the age of twenty one years. It is my will that the legacy be left him shall descend to my four above named children. It is my will that my after born children be provided for. I direct my executors to pay some attention to the raising and have him educated to be a good English Scholar, I constitute and appoint my son Henry Marshall and Abraham Vines of Jefferson County Executors of this my last will and Testament. Meeting in each of them the power to convey or make title to the property devised to be sold. Lastly it is my will that all my town property from being in the town of Nicholasville be rented until my Executors may think best to sell it. 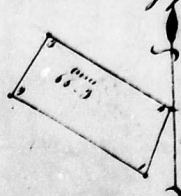
We the undersigned being appointed Commissioners of the State of Kentucky for Jefferson County at their December term 1890. For the purpose of settling the estate of Alexander Hinds dead his dower in the State of his dead husband agreeable to an agreement we met on the premises on the 30th day of December 1890 and being first sworn as the law directs proceeded to allot his dower as follows: First we assign his fifty acres of tract of land on which the at present resides commencing at the East corner of the South west base of said tract and running the full length of said line and across on the East line of said tract as to include the fifty acres by running a crop line parallel with the four described last line said fifty acres including the dwelling house bounded by the name of Peter and his three children, John, Mary, and John. Finally we allot his and third part when collected of the money arising from the sale of the personal estate of his dead husband. It is understood that should should the fifty acres above described not include the dwelling house it is then our opinion that in laying off his part of the land they shall run so far as the said line shall include the Northern boundary of the good named said dwelling house.
