my said sons here mentioned upon their paying to Peggy Craig and their heirs the sum of one hundred dollars each & also pay to John Dickerson or his heirs the sum of fifty dollars and my Executors are not to make distribution of the proceeds from the sale of the land to my sons until the aforesaid legacies are paid or secured to be paid to my said daughters and to said John Dickerson - I hereby constitute and appoint my friends George Schismore and Samuel Edworthy my Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills heretofore made Signed sealed and dated this fourth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three
