We the undersigned commissioners appointed by the Jessamine County Court at their December Court 1829 to allot to Margaret Craig late Margaret Hawkins her dower in the negroes of the estate of John Hawkins dec^d and also to divide the negroes among the heirs of said Hawkins, report. That we met at the house of Thomas Hawkins on the 7th Inst and proceeded to value the whole of said negroes which in our estimation amounted to the sum of \$10230, one third of this sum being \$3410 we have allotted to said Margaret Craig as her dower.
