The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Sesamine to settle with the Sheriff find a recd amount in the hands of the Sheriff amounting to one hundred and thirteen dollars and 31 cents, agreeable to the above account, given under our hands this 18th day of Nov^r 1830. This indenture, made and entered into in the year of our Lord, One thousand Eight hundred and twenty nine, and on this the fifteenth day of October, freely and honestly as to my conscience, and in my honest and sincere heart before my God, by whom I know I shall be judged at the last day and before all men, and the world, and in honour to myself and family, that this day I make a free and voluntary decree of all my estate real and personal, that God has given or blessed me with in this life, to be at my decease, distributed as follows (to wit) My first wish is, equal to, that after my death, that all my just debts be fairly adjusted and paid off. Then secondly, for the love and affection I have for my beloved wife Frances Shearwood, I will and bequeath unto her my negro girl by the name Sally about fourteen years of age and all her increase to be her lawful property during her natural life, and at her death to go to my youngest son George Shearwood, and that my beloved wife continues in the farm and in the house where I now live, during her life. And in the second place, I have given to my first son, children, six hundred acres of land, which I purchased of Samuel Long, lying and being in the County of Brackensridge, to them and their heirs forever, also to my beloved daughter Susanah Stout, I do freely will and bequeath one negro woman by the name of Kelly, about thirty four years of age, her and all her increase to her heirs forever, to be their lawful property and slaves. Unto my next daughter Kelly Pigg I freely give one negro boy named Dick about the age of thirteen to her and her heirs forever also to my son Peter Shearwood I will and bequeath one negro boy by the name of Daniel to him and his heirs forever, to have and both the said Daniel free from all claims. And unto my daughter Mary Stout or her heirs I will and freely give one negro boy by the name of Stewart to be their lawful and forever, and unto my son William Shearwood I give one negro girl by the name of Joel about two years old to him and his heirs forever. Unto my daughter Kelly Stout one negro boy by the name of Ben aged about two years old to her and her heirs forever. I therefore consider my first six children as having their just due when they have received the above named negroes which I have given at my decease or end of this life. With respect to my last eight children in the great love and parental feelings I have for them I make the following distribution of the balance of my estate real & personal, inclusive of what I have given my first six children. I bequeath to each of them as followeth First it is the wish and desire of my soul to give unto my son Thomas Shearwood one negro boy named Dennis about nine years old to him and his heirs forever. And to my son Charles Shearwood one negro girl by the name Lucinda about the age of six years, his and his increase, unto him and his heirs forever. And unto my daughter Susanah Romans I give one negro girl named Ginny about fourteen years of age, her and her increase to her and her heirs forever. Unto my son Stephen Shearwood I give one negro boy named Samuel about four years of age to him and his heirs forever. Also to my son Robert of Shearwood I give one negro woman named Hannah about thirty five years old, her and her increase, unto him and his heirs forever. And unto my son John Shearwood one negro man by the name of Jack about twenty seven years old to him and to his heirs forever and likewise to my youngest son George Shearwood I give one negro girl named Mary about two months old with all her increase to him and his heirs forever, and with respect to my farm in tract of land where I now live in Sesamine County Ky. that after my death and the death of my beloved wife that the said land be sold and equally and fairly divided between my last eight children as named above. Which tract of land contains sixty six acres and a half more, and like wise all the stock of every description that I may have at my decease with household & kitchen furniture and farming utensils &c &c. Having now fully and deliberately made a donation of all my worldly concerns agreeable to my desire, and to the

love and affection. I have for my loving wife and all my children, with out any permission by any one. I fully and solemnly resign my body to the debt from whence it came and my immortal soul unto the God who gave it, firmly believing that he will do right with all his creatures (and if the world in release of which and believing, I have discharged my duty with a clear conscience in what I have done in honor to my self and worthy and reverence to my God I humbly let my hand and offer my soul in the presence of.
