The dower land laid off as directed by said commissioners containing 40 acres and bounded as follows viz Beginning at a stone corner to the lands of Oliver Anderson and Lawrence March thence with said March line N 67° E 41 poles to a white oak corner to said March, thence S 2° E 41 poles to a white oak corner to the line thence with March line S 68° E 59 poles to a stone corner to the line thence with said March line N 77° E 40 poles to a white oak, thence N 31° E 63 poles to a stone corner and Hickory thence N 68° E 82 poles to a stone in said Anderson's line, thence with Anderson's line S 1/4° W 62 poles to the beginning.
