In obedience to an order of the County Court of Jefferson we the undersigned
Commissioners appointed to settle with the administrators of Elisha
Gravens deceased proceeded to perform the duties assigned report as
follows we find there came into the hands of the administrators in
cash from the sale of property and otherwise \$1090.43

In Negroes amounting to 3243.33
making the total amt of 4333.76

We find from the receipts and Vouchers produced to us there has

been paid out to the four female Legates on an arrangement and com-
promise of all the legates (they all being of lawful age) the sum of \$3233
17 cents including \$105 allowance to the administrators for all their time
be with the administration including \$5 to the commissioners for their
services which leaves a balance to the female legates of \$322.15 from the ad-
ministrators the landed State having been previously given up to the male
Legates making a full share to each of them. Given under our hands this
