In the name of Almighty God Amen I Jacob Dickerson of Jessamine County and State of Kentucky being in full health but of sound disposing mind and memory and owing to the certain and awful realities of the death of the mortal body and being desirous of making a disposition of the estate with which I am provided and kind Providence has thought proper to me do hereby publish and declare the following to be my last will and Testament to wit In the first place it is my will and desire that out of my estate my executors hereinafter named pay all my just debts secondly it is my will and desire that immediately after my death my two slaves Martha and her wife Leah be emancipated and set free and that James Gooch who I have appointed as one of my executors take the necessary legal steps to have the said slaves lawfully set free he they said Gooch from (where I purchased them) having agreed with me that he will exercise a care over them and be responsible for their not becoming chargeable to the County and that my other slave named Lucy at my death be also emancipated and set free by my executors in a lawful manner and to be mentioned out of my estate under the care of James Gooch Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my brother Henry Dickerson three hundred dollars to be paid over by my executors and it is further my wish that he shall not be held responsible for a note left in his hands due to my mother's

estate or for any money which he may have collected of the said estate —
Fourthly It is my will and desire that my executors hereinafter named do upon which such credit as they shall think most advisable and profitable make sale either privately or publicly of my landed estate and property in the town of Nicholasville and upon the receipt of the purchase money make a full conveyance for the same — It is also my will that my executors make public sale of the remainder of my estate personally upon a reasonable credit and out of the money arising from the sale of all my estate pay my debts and the legacy to my brother Henry above named and the residue it is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath to be equally divided between my brother John Reed George Reed and my sister Mary Rice wife of Samuel Reed and my sister Betsey Branner wife of Thomas Branner and Magdalina Reed wife of Henry Reed further it is my will that my brother George should be paid his portion which I have bequeathed to him provided he will bear an equal proportion with my other brother and sister of whatever they may be made responsible for on account of the sale of a tract of land in the State of Maryland and if he should not then my executors to reserve for that purpose as much out of his portion as will pay an equal share of said demand should any ever be made on account. It is further my desire that my brother Henry may not be responsible for any demands which may come against him or of my father on account of the sale of the tract of land aforesaid whatever his responsibility to which he might be made liable be accounted for out of my estate Fifthly I give and bequeath to my friend William Young son of all my medical books and lastly I do hereby appoint my friends James Gooch and William Duncan Executors to this my last will and Testament and should either of them die or refuse to do the other is vested with full power to carry in to full effect this my will my executors are authorized upon the receipt of the purchase money for the sale of some of my town lots which I have heretofore made to convey the titles for the same as also for a piece of land lying on marble creek sold by me to John Irvine — In testimony whereof I have here unto subscribed my name and affix my seal this sixteenth day of May 1827 —

The undersigned commissioners appointed by the Jefferson County Court to settle with the adm^r of David Hoover's estate and allot to the widow of said dec^d her dower, having attended to the duties assigned them beg leave to report as follows: We find that the said adm^r on chargeable with \$1147.13 1/2 the amount of sales as per sale bill and \$318.87 1/2 the amount received by the widow at the appraisal valued \$358.07 1/2 the amount due open accounts and cash.

\$1665.87 1/2 and of date of the last of said \$4489.96 making together the sum of

\$4489.96. It appears that \$905 of the above amount was open accounts against the heirs for money advances to them by the intestate in his life time and not intended to be collected. And \$117.07 1/2 in notes and open accounts against persons who have proved to be insolvent

305 making together \$1032.57 1/2 which being deducted from \$4489.96 leaves \$3457.38 1/2 the amt which the adm^r are properly chargeable with and upon which we have allowed them 5 per cent commission amounting to \$172.869. We find that the adm^r have disbursed for expenses and debts exclusive of legacies \$145.75. Add to this \$172.869 (this commission) makes the sum of \$318.619 which being deducted from the \$3457.38 1/2 leaves \$3138.76 1/2 which is the net amt of the estate. One third of this sum we have allotted to the widow as her dower say \$1045.92 1/2. The adm^r have disbursed to the heirs as part of their legacies the sum of \$1491 leaving a balance in the hands of the adm^r of \$1687.84 according to the foregoing account which is respectfully submitted to the court.
