and State of Kentucky being old and infirm in body but of sound and
disposing memory, and calling to mind the certainty of death, do make order
publick and declare this instrument as my last will and Testament -
First It is my desire that my daughter Sina Saunders wife of William
Saunders and her heirs have and hold the tract of Land whereon I now
live containing between fifty and sixty acres, be the same more or less
It being the Land I purchased from Hinton and Knapp and for which
Land I have two separate and of conveyance to have and to hold the tract
of Land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to my
said daughter Sina Saunders and her heirs forever. And it is further my
desire that should it so happen that I should depart this life at a time when
there may be a crop growing or standing on the above said land above begun
and then and in that event It is my desire that William Saunders
and his heirs shall have the crop that may be then growing or standing upon
the farm. I do further give and bequest to my said daughter Sina
Saunders two feather beds & furniture and one horse - one black lin
and her increase, the horse is by wheel, little wheel and a real one
flax hackle, and the flock of geese. I also will bequest to my son-in-law
William Saunders my twining lathe and all my sheepfold -
It is further my will and desire that all my just debts be paid, and as a part
and for that purpose, my Executor hereafter named, shall sell and dispose of all
my personal property not herein specifically disposed of at such a time
as may be thought best, and collect all the debts that may be due to me
at the time of my death, and after paying my debts as aforesaid the balance
being the proceeds of my property, shall be equally divided between all
my said children, namely between William Hill and his heirs,

Elyabeth Bentley or her heirs, Elias HED, Mary Carter wife of Joshua Carter, Sarah Stewart wife John Stewart & Hannah Shattuck wife of John Shattuck - It being my intention that William Saunders & his wife Sina are not to have any part of the proceeds arising from the sale of my personal property or of the cash which may be due to me at the time of my death and collect by my Executor - It is further my will and desire that my daughter Sina Saunders have my large family Bible - I do hereby appoint my son in law William Saunders, Executor of this my will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills. On the name of god amen I John Washington of the county of Upsumnd and State of Kentucky being seized of mind & memory knowing that it is appointed unto men once to die, do make & declare this my last will & testament, hereby revoking all former wills made by me -
In the manner & form following viz. It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate I then give & bequeath unto my wife Nancy Washington the whole of my estate, real & personal during her natural life - provided she remains unmarried - but if she marries after my death in that case I will & devise to her that part of my land lying northeast of the branch running from the land of Capt. Boyan & running through mine which will include to her my house & other buildings the part of the land not willed to her if she marries, to be rented out & the profits arising therefrom to be applied by my executor to her support if needed & I also give unto my wife Nancy Washington the one half of all my other property during her natural life - The part of my estate shall be appraised & the amount arising therefrom shall be divided into three equal parts, one of those parts shall be equally divided between Samuel R. Lawrence son of Rosanna Proctor Jane Baker daughter of Rosanna Proctor & the heirs of Nelson Hunt by his third wife Margaret Hunt - also if Jane Baker die without an heir born it is my will that her legacy shall revert to and become the property of Samuel R. Lawrence said son of Rosanna Proctor also - another third part of the estate I give and bequeath to the natural born children of Elizabeth Johnson wife of David Johnson to be equally divided amongst them - The other remaining third part of my estate be equally divided between the natural born children of Mary Kabin wife of Thomas Hummon Kabin all of which several legacies I will and devise unto the persons herein named & to be my black man Amy after my death should prove refractory & disobedient I will that she be sold at public sale to the desire of my wife - by my executor I will that the above legacies be permitted to take their full effect at the appointment of my executor provided the black people do not claim to go to any of the legacies they have the privilege of choosing their master provided they choose persons that are able & willing to give the worth of them - I appoint my wife Nancy Washington executrix with my friends Samuel Boyan and Samuel R. Lawrence Executors of this my last will & testament - hereby making
