 appoint my friend David Reeves Executor of this my last will and testament  
 It is my will that as soon after my death as practicable my said executor  
 shall proceed to sell at public sale the whole of my estate both real and  
 personal, and collect all debts due me and the money arising from both  
 sale and collection to be by him disposed of as follows. Whereas Elizabeth  
 Turner of said county was between six and seven years ago delivered of a  
 female child named Elizabeth this said child I do acknowledge to be  
 mine, and it is my will that the money arising from the sale of my  
 estate and collection of debts shall be by my said executor loaned out  
 at interest until the said child Elizabeth shall arrive at the age of twenty  
 one years and then pay over to her the whole of the principal. But should  
 the said Elizabeth marry before she arrives at the age of twenty one years  
 then in that case I will that my said executor pay it over to her immediately  
 by upon her marriage. If the said Elizabeth should die before she arrives  
 at the age of twenty one years and have no child or children then it  
 is my will that the whole of said money be divided between my son  
 Robert and should she have a child or children then it is my will
